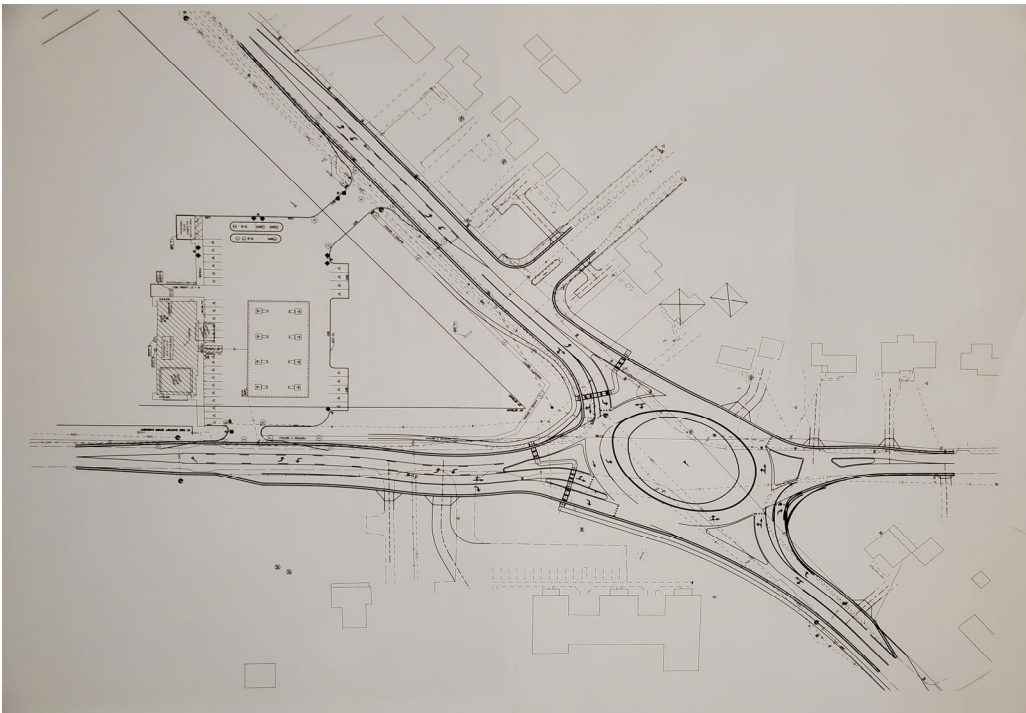

Trenton Road & Wayne Madison Road Roundabout

Modern roundabouts have proven to be a safer, more efficient alternative to traditional intersections at certain locations. Stop signs and signals do not guarantee that motorists will stop, Roundabouts inherent safety features, act as calming devices that force drivers to slow down. Accidents that occur are almost always less severe.

According to the Butler County Engineer's Office, roundabouts have resulted in: 63% reduction in overall crashes, 80% fewer injury crashes and 100% reduction in serious and fatal crashes. This compares with a national average of 40, 75, and 90 percent, respectively. Butler County's roundabouts are doing better, or outperforming the national statistics.

Because roundabouts improve the efficiency of traffic flow, they also reduce vehicle emissions and fuel consumption. During peak traffic hours roundabouts carry about 30 percent more vehicles than signalized intersections, resulting in less stopping, fewer delays, and better fuel efficiency.

We're looking forward to having a safer path to travel in the near future!

Citizen Request Tracker

Our new website, allows for you to submit your various requests (general requests, Planning and Zoning related requests, Non-Emergency Police Requests, and Service Department requests) within a centralized database. It's designed to send each request to the appropriate City staff.
